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LGPS England & Wales Scheme Advisory Board (SAB)

SAB website updated

Statement on FOI requests on climate advice and data

On 30 March 2023, the Board published <u>a statement on Freedom of Information</u> (FOI) requests on climate advice and data.

The Board is aware of the increasing prevalence of information requests about responsible investment policies. These may come from interested scheme members or activist groups and can be "round robin" requests that are made to all administering authorities with a view to collating information across the scheme and making comparisons between authorities' responses.

The statement provides advice on dealing with these requests.

Gender pensions gap report

On 29 March 2023, the Board published <u>a report on the gender pensions gap in the</u> <u>LGPS</u> from the Government Actuary's department.

The report provides an initial overview of the gender pensions gap in the LGPS, based on data from the 2020 scheme valuation. It shows the difference (in men's favour) is 34.7 per cent in the CARE scheme and 46.4 per cent in the final salary scheme. The Board notes that these findings need to be interpreted with caution.

The Board will do further work to understand the data and investigate causes, as well as considering possible next steps.

LGPS England & Wales

Government responds to McCloud consultation

On 6 April 2023, the Department for Levelling Up, Communities and Housing (DLUHC) published their response to the consultation on amendments to the underpin.

The consultation proposed changes to the underpin to address the discrimination found in the McCloud judgment and to ensure that it works effectively and consistently for all qualifying members. The consultation ended on 8 October 2020.

Alongside the response, in collaboration with the Scheme Advisory Board, DLUHC published a <u>factsheet summarising the remedy for members</u>. We have added a link to the factsheet on <u>the McCloud FAQs</u> page of <u>www.lgpsmember.org</u>.

DLUHC expects to launch a further consultation this spring. The consultation will seek views on:

- issues that, because of the consultation responses, they have not yet made a final decision on (such as aggregation and flexible retirement),
- issues not included in the original consultation (such as compensation, interest and excess teacher service), and
- updated draft regulations.

DLUHC will finalise the regulations after considering the responses to the further consultation. These will come into force on 1 October 2023, with backdated effect to 1 April 2014.

New LGPS employers in Wales

The Government recently made <u>The Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act</u> <u>2021 (Corporate Joint Committees) (Consequential Amendments) Order 2023</u>. The Order came into force on 1 April 2023.

The Order extends the LGPS to employees of:

- Mid Wales Corporate Joint Committee
- North Wales Corporate Joint Committee
- South East Wales Corporate Joint Committee
- South West Wales Corporate Joint Committee.

The Order also specifies the appropriate administering authority for each one.

We have updated the timeline regulations.

LGPS Scotland

New versions of employee guides published

On 27 April 2023, Steven Moseley emailed administering authorities letting them know we have published version 2.3 of the employee brief guide, version 2.2 of the councillor brief guide and version 1.2 of the retirement planning guide.

HMRC

Newsletter 149

On 26 April 2023, HMRC published <u>newsletter 149</u>. The newsletter contains articles on:

- the annual allowance calculator currently members cannot use it for tax year 2023/24
- Pension Scheme Returns
- reminding schemes to use the Managing Pension Schemes service to submit any new Accounting for Tax returns for any quarter beginning on or after 1 April 2020
- an update on submitting Event Reports.

Update on death grant process

On 6 April 2023, Lorraine Bennett forwarded an email from HMRC.

HMRC confirms that schemes can continue the current process when paying death grants that may exceed the lifetime allowance (LTA).

Under this process, the member's personal representative identifies if there is an excess amount after the administering authority has paid the death grant and, if so, reports this to HMRC, who then assesses the tax due. This process will continue until HMRC develop a longer-term position for the full abolition of the LTA from 6 April 2024.

The <u>LTA guidance newsletter</u> had set out a different process. Under this, administering authorities would liaise with the personal representative before paying a death grant to determine whether it was taxable and, if so, tax the excess as if it was pension income. Concerns were raised about this at the first LTA working group held on 4 April 2023, after which the new process was withdrawn.

HMRC repeated the information in the email in <u>newsletter 149</u>.

Pensions dashboards ('dashboards')

TPR dashboard webinar

The Pensions Regulator held a webinar on dashboards on 30 March 2023.

The webinar covered data preparation duties and the steps schemes need to take to ensure their data is accurate, complete, up-to-date and digitally accessible.

Corporate plan 2023/24

On 21 April 2023, TPR published its Corporate Plan for 2023/24.

The plan outlines TPR's key priorities for the year. These include:

 working with the Financial Conduct Authority and DWP to develop a value for money framework

- launching the new defined benefit funding code
- laying foundations for a significant increase in addressing quality outcomes in defined contribution schemes
- increasing its attention on tackling scammers
- supporting schemes to prepare for dashboards.

The document also includes TPR's plans beyond March 2024.

On 24 April 2023, TPR published new guidance on liability driven investments (LDI). The guidance sets out further practical steps schemes should take to manage risks.

TPR authorises first CDC scheme

On 13 April 2023, TPR authorised the UK's first collective defined contribution (CDC) scheme: the Royal Mail Collective Pension Plan. See <u>TPR's press release</u> for more information.

Transfers to CDC schemes listed as authorised by TPR satisfy 'the First condition' for the purposes of The Occupational and Personal Pension Schemes (Conditions for Transfers) Regulations 2021. You can find <u>the list of authorised CDC schemes</u> on TPR's website.

Non club transfers out technical guide

On 14 April 2023, Jayne Wiberg emailed administering authorities letting them know we published version 2.4 of the Non-Club Transfers Out Technical Guide.

Changes are made to refer to the:

- publication of <u>version 3.0 of Pension Scams Industry Group (PSIG) interim</u> <u>code of good practice</u>
- new requirement to report transfer requests of concern to the Financial Conduct Authority.

Minor changes to the text have also been made. These are not shown in track changes because they do not change the meaning.

McCloud remedy consultation – Welsh firefighters

The Welsh Government has published <u>a consultation setting out the proposed</u> <u>McCloud remedy</u> for the Welsh Firefighters' Pension Scheme. The consultation closes on 23 June 2023.

Retained firefighters' consultation

On 31 March 2023, the Home Office launched a <u>consultation on retained</u> <u>firefighters' pensions</u> in England. The consultation closes on 9 June 2023.

The proposals will allow retained firefighters employed between 7 April 2000 and 5 April 2006 to buy their pre-July 2000 service for pension purposes.

Voluntary NI contributions deadline extended

In <u>a written ministerial statement</u> published on 7 March 2023, the Government announced it was extending the deadline to pay voluntary National Insurance (NI) contributions from 5 April 2023 to 31 July 2023. This applies for tax years 2006/07 to 2016/17.

Paying voluntary NI contributions enables individuals to fill gaps in their NI record to boost their State Pension.
