1. Introduction

The guide is for Scottish administering authorities.

When calculating a survivor pension in respect of membership before 1 April 2015, what membership you will use depends on the following factors:

- when the active membership ended
- when the member died
- the type of survivor (eg a female survivor of an opposite-sex marriage)
- whether the marriage / civil partnership / cohabiting partnership was entered into before or after the member left the active membership.

The aim is to set out what membership you use when calculating a survivor pension for membership built up before 1 April 2015.

The guide does not set out what you use to calculate survivor pensions under the 2015 Scheme. This is because the factors above do not impact on what you use.

2. How to use the guide

The guide sets out what membership you use to calculate survivor partner pensions and eligible children's pensions for membership built up (or treated as having built up) before 1 April 2015.

If the member joined before 1 April 2015 and left on or after then, you need to calculate the survivor pension under the 2015 Scheme and add that figure to the survivor pension for membership built up before 1 April 2015.

The guide applies to councillors and non-councillors.

The guide sets out what you should use for each type of survivor and covers:

- Section 3 cohabiting partners
- Section 4 female survivors of opposite-sex marriages
- <u>Section 5</u> male survivors of opposite-sex marriages
- Section 6 survivors of same-sex civil partnerships

- Section 7 survivors of same-sex marriages
- Section 8 eligible children.

In those sections, where a term is defined, we have linked the term to its definition in section 10.

In section 11 we have listed the legislation we have relied on.

The Local Government Pension Scheme (Scotland) (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations 2022 ('the Amendment Regulations') amended the rules on what membership you use to calculate survivor pensions for membership built up (or treated as having built up) before 1 April 2015. A lot of the amendments are retrospective and you will need to revisit calculations for past deaths. To help you identify cases, we have set out the scenarios which are impacted by the Amendment Regulations.

The guide does not apply to:

- deaths that happened before 5 December 2005
- members to whom regulation E19 of the Local Government Superannuation (Scotland) Regulations 1987 apply. These are members who were in the Scheme before 16 May 1974 and were entitled under the Acts of 1937 to 1953 to benefits which did not include a lump sum and a widow's pension, or to benefits which did not include a widow's pension and where the member did not make an election under E19(3) of the Local Government Superannuation (Scotland) Regulations 1974
- members entitled to equivalent pension benefits.

3. Cohabiting partners

Following the death of a member (councillor or non-councillor) who left active membership after 31 March 2009, you identified their cohabiting partner is eligible to receive a survivor partner's pension.

This means you are satisfied that the member and the partner were able to marry or form a civil partnership with each other on the date the member died. You are also satisfied that the following conditions were met for a continuous period of at least two years ending with the member's date of death:

- the member and the partner were living together as if they were a married couple or civil partners
- neither the member nor the partner were living with a third person as if they were a married couple or civil partners
- either the partner was financially dependent on the member, or the member and the partner were financially interdependent.

Where the member died before 1 June 2018, the member and the partner would also need to have been free to marry or form a civil partnership with each other for the continuous period (rather than just on the date of death).

For deaths occurring after 31 March 2015, if the member has any <u>relevant additional membership</u>, you need to determine whether the couple were previously cohabiting with each other while the member was active after 31 March 2009.

4. Opposite-sex marriages - female survivor

A male member died leaving a female survivor of an opposite-sex marriage.

Other than where the member was a councillor member, you need to confirm whether the marriage took place before the member left the active membership. If the marriage took place after the member left the active membership, you need to determine whether the couple were previously married to each other while the member was an active member after 31 March 1972.

If the member was a councillor member, when calculating the survivor partner's pension for membership before 1 April 2015, you use the member's total membership.

Table 2 - sets out what membership you use to calculate the survivor pension payable to a female survivor of an opposite-sex marriage (non-councillor members) for membership before 1 April 2015. Other than where the member died in service, the table is also relevant when calculating the short-term pension if payable.

5. Opposite-sex marriages - male survivor

A female member died leaving a male survivor of an opposite-sex marriage.

Other than where the member was a councillor member, you need to confirm whether the marriage took place before the member left the active membership. If the marriage took place after the member left the active membership, you need to determine whether the couple were previously married to each other while the member was an active member after 31 March 1972.

If the member was a councillor member, when calculating the survivor partner's pension for membership before 1 April 2015, you use the member's total membership.

Table 3 - sets out what membership you use to calculate the survivor pension payable to a male survivor of an opposite-sex marriage (non-councillor members) for membership before 1 April 2015. Other than where the member died in service, the table is also relevant when calculating the short-term pension if payable.

6. Same-sex civil partners

A member died leaving a survivor of a same-sex civil partnership.

Other than where the member was a councillor member, you need to confirm whether the civil partnership took place before the member left the active membership.

If the member was a councillor member, when calculating the survivor partner's pension for membership before 1 April 2015, you use the member's <u>total membership</u>.

If the member elected to pay additional contributions under regulation 17A of the Local Government Pension Scheme (Scotland) Regulations 1998 to count pre-6 April 1988 membership, the regulations are silent on how this membership might be included in the surviving civil partner's pension calculation, where the member paid for pre-6 April 1978 membership and the civil partnership took place after the member left the active membership.

Table 4 - sets out what membership you use to calculate the survivor pension payable to a survivor of a same-sex civil partnership (non-councillor members) for membership before 1 April 2015. Other than where the member died in service, the table is also relevant when calculating the short-term pension if payable.

7. Same-sex marriages

A member died leaving a survivor of a same-sex marriage.

Other than where the member was a councillor member, you need to determine whether the marriage took place before the member left the active membership.

Where a member has converted a same-sex civil partnership into a same-sex marriage, the same-sex marriage is to be treated as if it began when the civil partnership took place.

If the member was a councillor member, when calculating the survivor partner's pension for membership before 1 April 2015, you use the member's total membership.

Table 5 - sets out what membership you use to calculate the survivor pension payable to a survivor of a same-sex marriage (non-councillor members) for membership before 1 April 2015. Other than where the member died in service, the table is also relevant when calculating the short-term pension if payable.

8. Eligible children

A member died leaving eligible children.

9. LGPS (Scotland) (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations 2022

The Local Government Pension Scheme (Scotland) (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations 2022 were laid on 3 May 2022. The regulations make several amendments to the rules governing what membership you use to calculate survivor partner pensions for membership before 1 April 2015. Primarily, the changes are made in response to two court cases: Walker v Innospec and Mrs Goodwin v the Department for Education.

In summary, the regulations:

- effective for deaths after 4 December 2005 for survivors of non-councillor members who are male survivors of opposite-sex marriages, survivors of same-sex civil partnerships and survivors of same-sex marriages:
 - place them in a similar position to female survivors of opposite-sex marriages
 - confirm that you always use <u>relevant additional membership</u> or <u>E6(3A) membership</u>
- effective for deaths after 31 March 2015 for survivors of councillor members:
 - confirm you always use <u>total membership</u> when calculating pensions payable to survivors of opposite-sex marriages, samesex civil partnerships and same-sex marriages.

The Amendment Regulations also make several technical changes to confirm the policy intent.

You need to:

- · amend your systems / calculations for future deaths, and
- revisit the calculations for deaths that have occurred in the past.

To assist, the following table sets out the specific cases where the Amendment Regulations have changed what you use. You must recalculate all the survivor benefits set out in the table.

For councillors, we have not shown cases where the Amendment Regulations require you to use <u>total membership</u>, rather than membership after 5 April 1978 or 1988 plus <u>relevant additional membership</u>. This is because the outcome is the same as councillors will not have any membership before 6 April 1978 or 1988 and in both cases, you will use relevant additional membership.

The Scottish Public Pensions Agency confirmed the following in Circular 2022/04:

"Where the recalculation of a partner's pension causes a reduction to the rate of an eligible child's pension, administering authorities will need to recalculate that child's pension and adjust future payments. We would not expect authorities to recoup past overpayments."

10. Meaning of terms used

Contracted-out membership after 5 April 1978

Contracted-out membership means <u>Membership after 5 April 1978</u> excluding transferred-in membership.

E6(3A) membership

E6(3A) membership includes, for a member who left the active membership before 1 April 1998:

- enhancement awarded on ill health retirement after 5 April 1978
- added years the member bought either by lump sum or by regular contributions, but only where the lump sum was made after 5 April 1978 or where the regular contributions started after 5 April 1978
- added years awarded by the employer where the resolution was passed after 5
 April 1978
- where the member holds reckonable service after 5 April 1988, membership before 1 April 1986 for which the member paid extra to convert from qualifying service to reckonable membership. Note that there is an error in the regulations for members who elected to convert membership before 1 April 1986 from qualifying service to reckonable membership and who do not hold reckonable service after 5 April 1988. The regulations are unclear on whether the converted membership counts as E6(3A) membership. We don't, however, anticipate many (if any) cases
- membership bought by certain members who were active before 1 April 1998 (for example, manual workers who had a 12-month waiting period) for periods where the member was not eligible to be an active member, but only where the payment was made after 5 April 1978.

When calculating a long-term pension, you ignore any 1/240th increase to certain additional membership the member bought or was awarded by their employer.

Membership after 5 April 1978

Membership after 5 April 1978 is generally any period of membership between 6 April 1978 and 31 March 2015 (inclusive) for which the member has paid / treated as having paid / deemed by the employer to have paid contributions. It includes

transferred-in membership where the transfer value was received after 5 April 1978 which purchased pre-April 2015 membership.

However. It excludes any <u>E6(3A) membership</u> and any <u>relevant additional</u> membership.

When calculating a long-term pension, you ignore any 1/240th increase to certain additional membership the member bought or was awarded by their employer.

Membership after 5 April 1988

Membership after 5 April 1988 is generally any period of membership between 6 April 1988 and 31 March 2015 (inclusive) for which the member has paid / treated as having paid / deemed by the employer to have paid contributions. It includes transferred-in membership where the transfer value was received after 5 April 1988 which purchased pre-April 2015 membership.

However, It excludes any <u>E6(3A) membership</u> and any relevant additional membership.

When calculating a long-term pension, you ignore any 1/240th increase to certain additional membership the member bought or was awarded by their employer.

Relevant additional membership

Relevant additional membership in respect of a member who left the active membership after 31 March 1998 includes:

- enhancement awarded on ill health retirement before 1 April 2015
- membership awarded by the employer where the resolution was made after 5
 April 1978*
- added years the member bought either by lump sum or by regular contributions, but only where the lump sum was made, or the regular contributions started, after 5 April 1978*
- membership treated as post 5 April 1978* membership by virtue of the LGPS (Transitional Provisions) Regulations 1998, such as (but not limited to):
 - membership from 1 April 1972 to 5 April 1978* where a female member paid contributions (or contributions were deemed to be paid) for that period to count towards a long-term pension to a male survivor of an opposite-sex marriage

- membership before 1 April 1972 where a female member paid contributions for that period to count towards a long-term pension to a male survivor of an opposite-sex marriage
- Membership awarded by an employer who passed a resolution after 5 April 1978* to convert added years awarded under the compensation regulations into membership
- Membership the member bought by way of a lump sum made after 5 April 1978* permitted by the Retirement Benefits Schemes (Continuation of Rights of Members of Approved Schemes) Regulations 1990 ie if additional payments made by a Class B or C member under an agreement started before 1 April 1998 (other than AVCs), when added to the member's basic pension contributions, obligatory and optional contributions during an absence and contributions to a FSAVC scheme, exceeded 15 per cent of remuneration, the member was allowed to pay a lump sum representing the excess to the Scheme.

When calculating a long-term pension, you ignore any 1/240th increase to certain additional membership the member bought or was awarded by their employer.

*references to "5 April 1978" are references to "5 April 1988" for survivor pensions payable to cohabiting partners.

Total membership

As a general rule, this means the membership that has been used to calculate the deceased member's benefits. It includes, though is not limited to:

- membership before 1 April 2015 for which the member has paid (or is treated as having paid) contributions
- transferred-in membership which purchased pre-April 2015 membership
- enhancement awarded on ill health retirement before 1 April 2015
- where the member died as an active member before 1 April 2015, for the purposes of the long-term pension, the ill health enhancement that would have been added had the member become entitled to an ill health pension on the date of death
- added years the member bought or was awarded
- part-time buyback membership

- membership bought by certain members who were active before 1 April 1998 (for example, manual workers who had a 12-month waiting period) for periods during which the member was not eligible to be an active member
- membership before 1 April 1986 for which the member paid extra to convert from qualifying service to reckonable membership
- Membership awarded by an employer to convert added years awarded under the compensation regulations into membership
- Membership the member bought by way of a lump sum made permitted by the
 Retirement Benefits Schemes (Continuation of Rights of Members of Approved
 Schemes) Regulations 1990 ie if additional payments made by a Class B or C
 member under an agreement started before 1 April 1998 (other than AVCs),
 when added to the member's basic pension contributions, obligatory and optional
 contributions during an absence and contributions to a FSAVC scheme,
 exceeded 15 per cent of remuneration, the member was allowed to pay a lump
 sum representing the excess to the Scheme
- If not mentioned above, though not as a duplication, <u>E6(3A) membership</u> or relevant additional membership as appropriate.

When calculating a long-term pension, you ignore any 1/240th increase to certain additional membership the member bought or was awarded by their employer.

For certain male members who left after 31 March 1998, their membership before 1 April 1972 may have been reduced to 89% of its length.
